## GOLF COURSE DESIGNATIONS

A green circle means the course is beginner-friendly. A blue square means the course has an intermediate level of difficulty. A black diamond means the course is extremely challenging with many hazards and/or blind shots. Courses with two symbols have a difficulty factor somewhere in between. We hope that this system will assist members in determining what courses are suited to their level of play.
